SEARCH THE BIBLE



Colossians 1:15, 20. *Christ is the visible image of the invisible God. He existed before anything was created and is supreme over all creation...and through him God reconciled everything to himself. He made peace with everything in heaven and on earth by means of Christ's blood on the cross.*

Five things this passage tells me about Jesus.

Philippians 3:8-9. *Yes, everything else is worthless when compared with the infinite value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have discarded everything else, counting it all as garbage, so that I could gain Christ and become one with him.*

APPLY THE TRUTH PERSONALLY

If you want to know who God is, know Jesus.

Jesus said, "I am..."

...the bread of life" (John 6:35).

...the light of the world" (John 8:12).

...the way, the truth, and the life" (John 14:6).

...the vine; you are the branches" (John 15:5).

LISTEN TO OTHERS DEEPLY

THIS WEEK, SHARE THE SALT VIDEO

“Have You
Ever Wondered
About God?”



Share it on social media or on your phone as you sit next to your friend—whatever fits you best. Pray before you share it, and follow it up with, “I want to know what you think.” Ask questions, listen, and engage in give-and-take conversation.

Ask questions like:

- What did you think of the video?
- What do *you* think God is like?
- Do you come from a religious background? If so, what was it like?
- Where does your view of God come from?
- Do you think it's legit to decide what we want God to be like and then believe that about Him?
- Have you ever thought about the God-human connection as a “relationship,” instead of as a “religion”?



TALK

ABOUT THE GOSPEL

Once you better understand where the other person is coming from, talk about the Gospel.

Say something like:



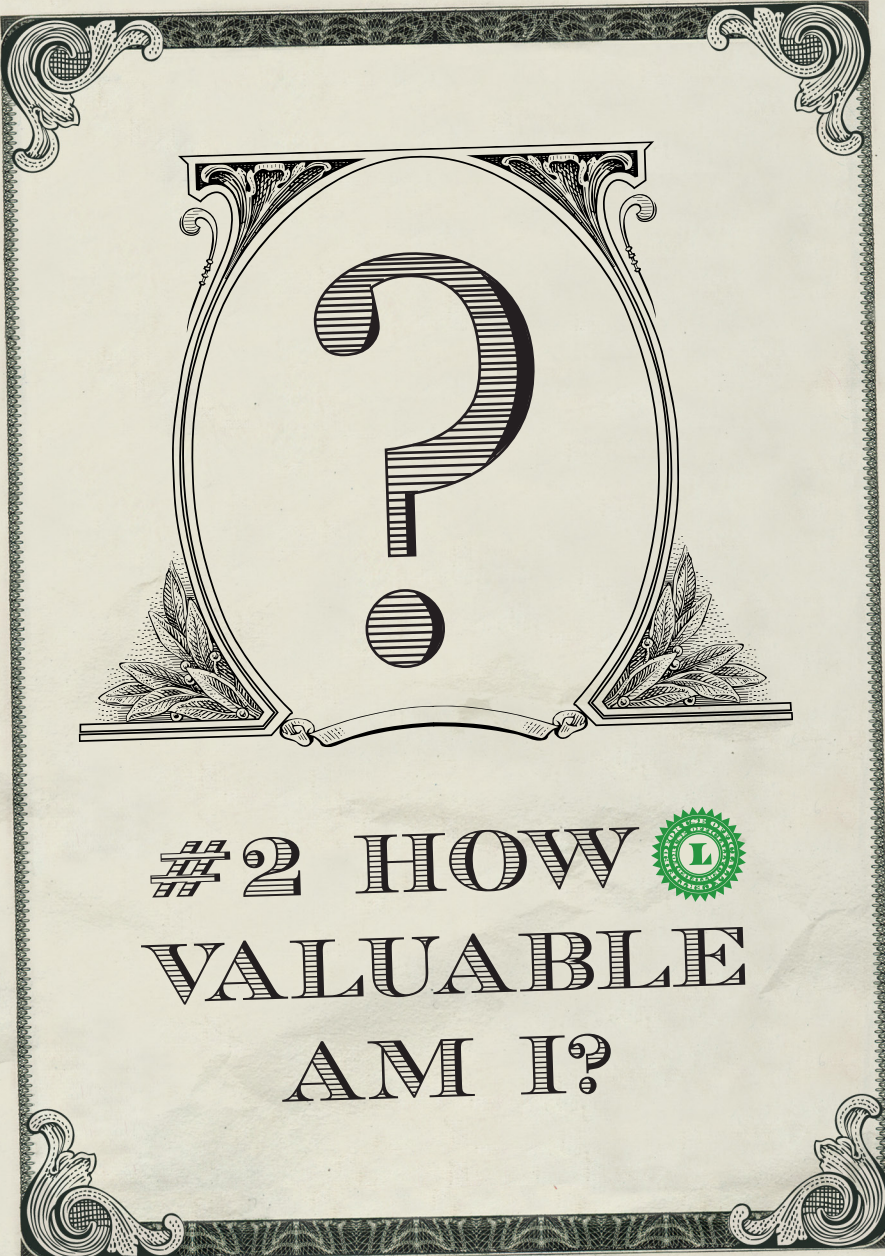
Jesus showed us what God is like—relational, loving, giving, and forgiving. Has anyone ever explained Jesus's Gospel message to you?



Then take them to the cross by talking about John 3:16: *For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life* (NIV).

SEARCH THE BIBLE

JOHN 8:3-11

As he was speaking, the teachers of religious law and the Pharisees brought a woman who had been caught in the act of adultery. They put her in front of the crowd.

“Teacher,” they said to Jesus, “this woman was caught in the act of adultery. The law of Moses says to stone her. What do you say?”

They were trying to trap him into saying something they could use against him, but Jesus stooped down and wrote in the dust with his finger. They kept demanding an answer, so he stood up again and said, “All right, but let the one who has never sinned throw the first stone!” Then he stooped down again and wrote in the dust.

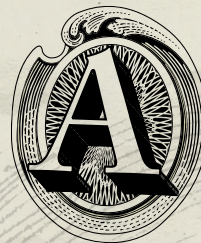

LISTEN TO OTHERS DEEPLY

Pray, and then share the *Salt* clip “How Valuable Am I?” Follow up, listen, and engage in conversation.



ASK QUESTIONS LIKE:

- What did you think of the video?
- Where do you think a person's value comes from?
- Do you sometimes try to find your value in what people think of you? Or your clothes... your tech toys... your sports ability... or whatever?
- Have you ever felt like you don't matter?
- Do you think people are beyond the reach of God's love and His valuing them?



TALK ABOUT THE G.O.S.P.E.L.



God created us to be with Him.

Know that the Lord is God. It is he who made us, and we are his (Psalm 100:3a, NIV).



Our sins separate us from God.

For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God (Romans 3:23, NIV).



Sins cannot be removed by good deeds.

All of us have become like one who is unclean, and all our righteous acts are like filthy rags (Isaiah 64:6a, NIV).



Paying the price for sin, Jesus died and rose again.

But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us (Romans 5:8, NIV).



Everyone who trusts in Him alone has eternal life.

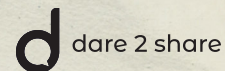
For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life (John 3:16, NIV).

#3 WHAT HAPPENS AFTER WE DIE?

SEARCH THE BIBLE

JOHN 3:16-18

For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him. Whoever believes in him is not condemned, but whoever does not believe stands condemned already because they have not believed in the name of God's one and only Son (NIV).

JOHN 14:6

Jesus told him, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one can come to the Father except through me" (NIV).

2 THESSALONIANS 1:7-10

...He will come with his mighty angels, in flaming fire, bringing judgment on those who don't know God and on those who refuse to obey the Good News of our Lord Jesus. They will be punished with eternal destruction, forever separated from the Lord and from his glorious power. When he comes on that day, he will receive glory from his holy people—praise from all who believe. And this includes you, for you believed what we told you about him (NIV).

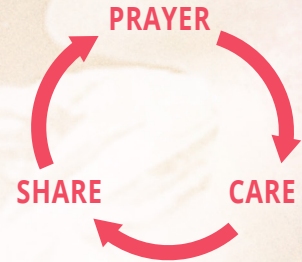

LISTEN TO OTHERS DEEPLY

Pray. Share the video "Then What?"



Follow up, and engage in give-and-take conversation. Almost everyone is interested in talking about the afterlife, because it's intriguing.

ASK QUESTIONS LIKE:

- What did you think of the video?
- What do you think happens after we die?
- If Heaven exists, what do you think determines whether or not someone goes there?
- Is being "good enough," compared with other people, enough for God to let you into Heaven?
- How does being "good enough" measure up against God's standard of perfect holiness?
- Have you ever wondered how a loving God could send people to an eternal Hell?
- If you were to die tonight, do you know where you would spend eternity?

TALK ABOUT THE GOSPEL

SAY SOMETHING LIKE:

Did you know that the Bible says "nothing impure will ever enter" Heaven (Revelation 21:27)? That means our efforts to be "good enough" by doing good things are like putting white frosting on a burned cake. Underneath the frosting, the cake is still burned. That's why we need the forgiveness of sin that Jesus came to provide.

Then explain the Gospel message. You can use these faith-sharing tools to help you:

2 Peter 3:9

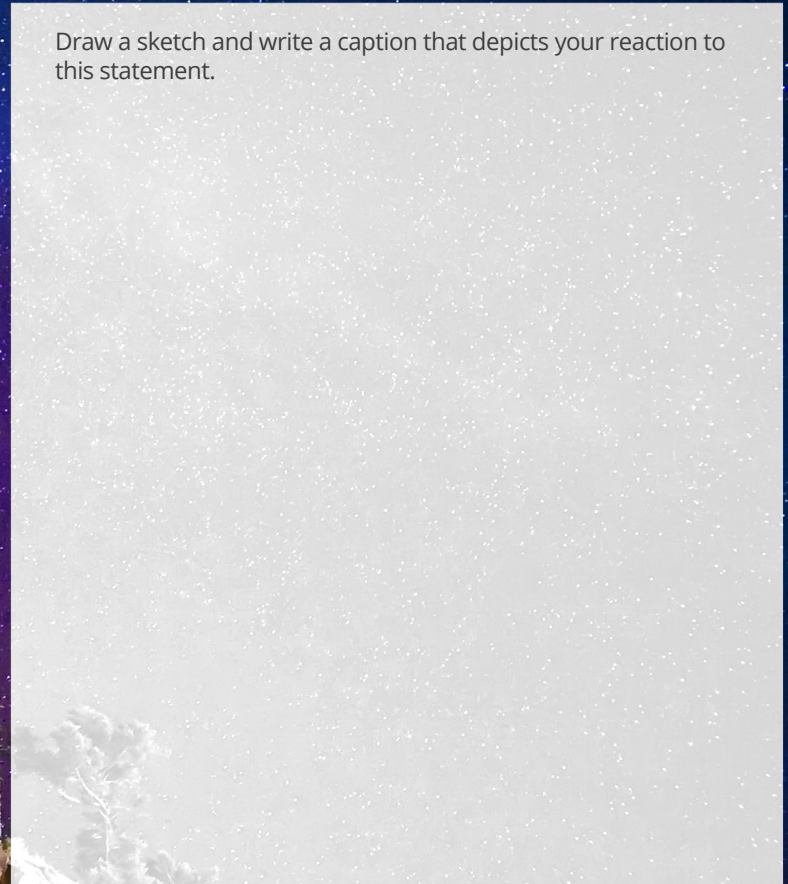

Listen to Others Deeply

Share the video
"Why Does God Let Bad Things Happen?"



Pray for the person you're going to share it with, and then follow up. Be sensitive as you approach people who may be hurting badly or angry at God. Once you get a pulse on where they're at, you can decide whether it's a time to just comfort someone in pain or a time to explore this deeper theological topic with them.

Ask questions like:

- What did you think of the video?
- Have you ever wondered about this question before?
- What's your theory about why the world is so messed up?
- Why doesn't God just wipe away everything bad?
- I've heard it said that if God wiped away all evil, we would all be wiped away too. Do you agree or disagree? Why?
- Have you ever been mad at God?
- Do you have the kind of relationship with God that you can go to Him with your anger or pain?

If they just need to be comforted, say something like, "I know I can't fully understand, but I'm so sorry and I'm here."

Talk About the Gospel

Say something like:

Did you know that God wants the kind of intimate, personal relationship with you where you can always come to Him with your anger and pain?

Then explain the Gospel. Share how Jesus identifies with our suffering, because He suffered too. Explain what the Bible says about how, in the end, God's going to make things right because of what Jesus did on the cross.

SEARCH THE BIBLE



1 Corinthians 13:4-7 *Love is patient and kind. Love is not jealous or boastful or proud or rude. It does not demand its own way. It is not irritable, and it keeps no record of being wronged. It does not rejoice about injustice but rejoices whenever the truth wins out. Love never gives up, never loses faith, is always hopeful, and endures through every circumstance.*

Romans 5:8 *But God showed his great love for us by sending Christ to die for us while we were still sinners.*



APPLY THE TRUTH PERSONALLY

Do you really believe God loves you? Not *just* if you perform, if you serve Him, or if you do what's right?

God doesn't love you "if"...He doesn't love you "because"... He loves you...period.

Write a note to God. Bask in His unconditional love for you, and thank Him for it.



LISTEN TO OTHERS DEEPLY

Share the *Salt* video
"What Makes for Good Relationships?"



Pray for the person you want to share with, and then follow up with real conversation.

Ask questions like:

- What did you think of the video?
- What do you think makes for a good relationship?
- What do *you* do when your relationships bring pain?
- Have you ever experienced a relationship where the person is always there for you, even if you let them down again and again?

TALK ABOUT THE GOSPEL

Say something like:

Can I tell you about someone you can turn to for love, acceptance, comfort, and hope when your human relationships let you down?

Then explain God's unconditional love for them and walk them through the message of the Gospel.
